



NW KANSAS FIRE FUND

On Dec. 15, an estimated 400,000 acres burned in NW Kansas as hurricane- force winds swept through the state. It is believed that downed power lines sparked the fires that burned in five counties in a line 35 miles wide and 10 miles long. Twelve families lost their homes in Natoma alone. Two of those families are farmers who are members at Peace Lutheran Church, Natoma. The LCMS Kansas District has invited congregations and LCMS members to partner with these families in the rebuilding process by donating online on the Kansas District website or by sending checks to the LCMS Kansas District earmarked "NW Kansas Fire" before January 15, when the appeal ends. Funds will be distributed to the affected families at Peace, Natoma. If funds exceed the needs of these families, they will be forwarded to the LCMS Disaster Relief fund. Questions? KENTUCKY TORNADO RECOVERY UPDATE

Volunteers are needed to help with cleanup efforts following tornado activity in the Mayfield, KY area following tornado activity.

- Initial response: Dec. 17, 2021 Jan. 15, 2022. Sign up to respond at <u>LCMS-LERT.org</u>
- Nature of work: Debris removal, retrieval of personal effects and processing, chainsawing (for LERT chainsaw teams only), and support of those who have sustained loss in the storms.
- The Host congregation is **St. Paul Lutheran Church, 211 South 21st Street, Paducah, KY 42003**. Volunteers should be self-sufficient and bring bedding, cot/mattress, supplemental food, and any necessary work clothes and equipment for their shift.
- It is planned to provide an evening meal for LERT volunteers at the host site, but volunteers should have adequate supplemental food and funds, etc. for their use as the host site accommodations develop. Showers will be available at a local gym in Paducah. The kitchen is available for use at the host site.
- Any volunteers who show up without registering will be considered spontaneous and will not be permitted to join in the work until volunteer registration is completed.
- Background checks are <u>required</u> for all volunteers who will enter residences, retrieve or process personal items, work with youth, or stay at the LERT volunteer host site. *The background check is processed through the LCMS LERT system when you sign up for a shift.*
- Check the LCMS Disaster Response webpage and/or the Mid-South District website (mid-southlcms.org) for other information regarding current needs and/or donations.

Local COVID protocols cannot always be followed in a disaster response situation. We ride in trucks together and eat together, and sleeping quarters are not spacious. Each individual can socially distance according to their own comfort level.

Faithful Stewards of God's Gifts

You see an ad asking for volunteers to deliver to needy families some coats, hats, and gloves that have been purchased by a local charity. You volunteer to make six deliveries. At each home, the families shower you with praise for these thoughtful gifts. All day long you keep reminding them that you are only the messenger and that the gifts really came from the charity.

In a way, this story is a true parallel to our lives as we dispense God's gifts, whether that be caring for our families, supporting ministries that share Jesus, or sharing something with a neighbor who lives next door. Since all the gifts in our lives are God's gifts, we find ourselves constantly reminding those who thank us that we are simply sharing God's things with them. We are not really being generous. We are not leaving a personal legacy. 2021 Fiscal Year Ends January 15

The District will close its 2021 fiscal year on Friday, January 15, 2022. Anything received after that date from your congregation will be credited to the 2022 fiscal year. To meet the standards for a not-for-profit corporation audit, we cannot credit any mission commitments/gifts received in our office after the 2021 fiscal year end is closed; congregations must meet this deadline. If you are sending a 2022 gift prior to January 15, please indicate that it is to be posted to 2022 so that we may credit it correctly for your congregation. The 2021 year-end checklist is also available on the Kansas District website under the Business Office tab in the "Frequently Requested" box.



2022 Mileage Rates

Effective January 1, 2022: The IRS has increased the standard business mileage rate to 58.5¢ per mile. **The Kansas District mileage rate, set by the Board of Directors, is 5 cents below the IRS rate, or 53.5¢ per mile.** The standard medical and moving mileage rate is 18¢ per mile. These new rates apply to mileage reimbursements paid to an employee on or after January 1, 2022 with respect to transportation expenses paid or incurred by the employee on or after January 1, 2022.

The rate used for charitable deduction purposes, set by statute rather than IRS, remains at 14¢ per mile.

Good News for Linn Lutheran School
