KEYNOTE SPEAKER: Mark Schoepp



Mark Schoepp served the church as a Director of Christian Education for more than 30 years in four congregations. Mark and his wife, Becky, also toured with their children full-time for 12 years as Fitz Family Ministries, a unique family ministry and entertainment/juggling troupe. Late in his career Mark worked six years for Wheat Ridge Ministries as full-time Director of Congregation Engagement, where he developed a series of health and wellness workshops that he led in various venues across the country. Mark also served a one-year stint as Executive Director of ALOA, Adult Lutherans Organized for Action, focused on encouraging and equipping congregations for older adult ministry.

Since 1994, Mark has been following developments in the field of brain research and education, with a special interest in brain health and its application to the church, the church school, and the home.

Together with his wife Becky, they now focus their attention on family members as caregivers at any stage of life, and especially on the critical transitions that happen late in life around where to live.

BIBLE STUDY LEADER: Rev. Daniel Myers



Daniel Myers, associate pastor at Holy Cross Lutheran, Wichita, KS, attended Concordia Teachers College in Seward, Nebraska, graduating in 1977 with a Bachelor of Science degree (Lutheran School Teacher) and as a Director of Christian Education (DCE). While at Concordia, Seward, he met his wife, Connilee, and they were married in 1976. Dan and Connilee have two married children and six grandchildren.

His first call as DCE was to St. Paul Lutheran, Wisner, Nebraska. In 1979, the Lord called Dan to serve as DCE at Peace Lutheran, McCook, Nebraska.

In 1986, the Lord led Dan to enroll at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, Missouri. He served his vicarage at a mission congregation, Our Redeemer Lutheran in Independence, Iowa, with his vicarage supervisor, Rev. Frank Frye, at St. Peter Lutheran, Westgate, Iowa. Dan graduated from the Seminary in 1990 and received his first call to Our Redeemer Lutheran Church and School at Staplehurst, Nebraska, and was ordained on July 15, 1990. On May 15, 2002, Dan began serving Holy Cross Lutheran Church and School in Wichita, Kansas, with an emphasis on Adult Education and Family Ministry.
