June/July Devotion

We live in a beautiful state, surrounded by people from all walks of life. The Holy Scriptures not only call us the Body of Christ, but they also give another descriptive word for you and me—the "Royal Priesthood." Baptism brings us into a salvation relationship with God. As Christ the Head is the High Priest, every member of His body is part of the royal priesthood. We "share in a heavenly calling" with Him to the priesthood in Baptism.

What does a royal priest of God do? We sacrifice. We pray. We are taught. We worship. We are connected together in a common confession and faith. Our efforts have meaning and value because of Christ. His ultimate sacrifice on the cross prompts all the sacrifices of the royal priesthood. And we certainly have a great charge in front of us—to be His priests, His baptized, His salt and light, His body in this world. It is the privilege and joy of every believer to faithfully share Christ with others through our own words and deeds.
