October Devotion

"The saying is trustworthy, for: If we have died with Him, we will also live with Him; if we endure, we will also reign with Him; if we deny Him, He also will deny us; if we are faithless, He remains faithful—for He cannot deny Himself" (2 Timothy 2:11–13).

Many scholars consider Paul's second letter to Timothy as the last one he would ever write. Paul's time on this earth was quickly coming to an end. He had suffered tremendously for the sake of sharing the Gospel. Now, he was in prison with little chance of an acquittal. He wanted to tell Timothy to preserve the Gospel message pure and unchanged, to guard it against the increasing attacks of false teachers, to train other men to share it boldly and faithfully, and to be ready to suffer himself for the sake of defending it to others.

In his letter, Paul tells Timothy to "Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead" (v. 8). "**Remember**"—every church worker, every Christian is to remember who it is that we serve. Remembering calls to mind God's grace. God would remember Noah and His people forever with the sign of the rainbow in the sky. When God gave Moses the Ten Commandments on Mount Sinai, the people were to remember the Sabbath Day by keeping it holy. When Jesus was with the 12 apostles in the Upper Room, His own body and blood broken and shed for their sins would be done in remembrance for all that He had done.

These are rich memories that come to mind when we remember Jesus Christ! The cross is a reminder of God's grace shown to all as Christ suffered and died for our sins. The empty tomb is a reminder that He was bodily raised from the dead on the Third Day—the guarantee of our bodily resurrection on the Last Day. The baptismal font is a reminder of the washing of water in God's Name, that we have received the gift of faith, the forgiveness of our sins, and have been made to be the heirs of eternal life. The altar is the place where we remember that the living and risen Lord gives His people His true body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of our sins.

Jesus gave His own Words to His disciples. The writers recorded those Words and passed them on to us through the sacred Scriptures. Jesus' words simply do not fail. His promises are always reliable! **What do we do with these words?** The Christian's life in this world calls for endurance. We are being attacked. In the face of persecution, the living and exalted Lord says in **Mark 13:13**, "All men will hate you because of Me, but he who stands firm to the end will be saved." **Revelation 2:10**, "Be faithful, even to the point of death, and I will give you the crown of life." What an encouragement for patience in suffering! What admonition to remain faithful to the One who has laid down His life for us and taken that life back up again.

Dear friends, remember Christ and all that He has done for you. Remember Him through your daily repentance and returning to the forgiveness He has given to you in your baptism. Remember Him through your daily individual and family prayers and devotions. Remember Him through your weekly worship, church Bible study, and sacrificial giving. Remember Him as you joyously live out the Christian life in word and deed to those you are around in your daily vocation. **He always remains faithful to His promises for you, now and forever!**



Jesus Door-2-Door Event Rev. Timothy Koch, Pastor at Zion Lutheran, Linn



On September 17, **20 people** representing three congregations (St. Paul, Clay Center, Bethlehem,

Greenleaf, and Zion, Linn) gathered at St. Paul for a JD2D event.

Rev. Michael Hofmann led the group in a Bible study on evangelism themes in the Old Testament. The group then learned witnessing methods and role-played the canvassing survey. After lunch, they canvassed the surrounding neighborhoods.

Six teams knocked on 174 homes. 70 people answered the door, and of those, 48 agreed to take the survey. Congregational literature was left at the 104 houses where no one was home.

19 out of the 48 people (40%) were unchurched. When asked, "Where do you believe you will go when you die?" 31 people responded with "Heaven" *(although only 17 thought they would go to heaven on account of Jesus).* Eight people did not know, four chose not to answer, and five replied with various answers not related to heaven.

The Gospel was shared with 44 people, and four expressed a willingness for a follow-up visit.
