November Devotion

"Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing?...But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you" (Matthew 6:25, 33).

Do you believe that God is providing adequately to meet all of your needs? (*Pause for a moment to think about this.*) So, what was your answer? Lord willing, you answered "yes!" Yes, you believe without a shadow of a doubt that God **is** providing adequately to meet all of your needs.

Listen to what Luther says in the Fourth Petition of the Lord's Prayer; "Give us this day our daily bread." What does this mean? God certainly gives daily bread to everyone without our prayers, even to all evil people, but we pray in this petition that God would lead us to realize this and to receive our daily bread with thanksgiving. What is meant by daily bread? Daily bread includes everything that has to do with the support and needs of the body, such as food, drink, clothing, shoes, house, home, land, animals, money, goods, a devout husband or wife, devout children, devout workers, devout and faithful rulers, good government, good weather, peace, health, self-control, good reputation, good friends, faithful neighbors, and the like.

The list is endless of the ways that God has provided and still provides for us. Now, could things be a little better, a little easier? Sure, they always could. But for as much as our sinful selves like to think that God **isn't** providing adequately, we have many more reasons that He **is** providing adequately. Reasons that Luther lists in the Fourth Petition that we have just heard. Reasons that remind us of the way that God continually showers blessing after blessing upon His people.

Our bodies and breath, our families and friends, our time and talents, and our personalities and possessions are all gifts from God. We have nothing of our own to offer. As God has given us everything, He also gives us means to offer thanksgiving. In worship, we sing praises and say prayers of thanks. We offer monetary gifts representing our first fruits. We use the talents God has given us to glorify Him in our daily vocations as His baptized, royal priests.

Yes, baptized into His Name, we are currently under the Father's care. What does that mean? It means that we are *free* from worry about physical life, about food and clothing. As Jesus says, "We are worth more to our Father than birds and flowers" (ref. Matt. 6:26-30).

So, what do we seek and where do we look? We seek first the Kingdom of God, and we fix our eyes upon Jesus—the One who has come to save us, who provides for our daily needs and who will finally restore us. We fix our eyes upon the One who comes to give Himself to us in worship through Word and Sacrament.

God calls His people to worship Him with a pure heart. And from hearts that love and trust Him above all things, everything else flows in our lives. **To Him be the glory forever and ever!**



The group knocked on 165 doors in the surrounding neighborhoods. 62 people answered the door, and of those, 31 took the canvassing survey. Gospel and congregational literature was left at 103 houses, where no one was home.

When asked, "Are you familiar with St. Luke's Lutheran Church?" 19 participants (61%) answered "No."

When asked, "Do you currently go to church?" 10 people (32%) answered "No."

When asked, "Where do you believe you will go when you die?" 27 participants responded with "heaven" (although only 13 believed they would get there on account of Jesus Christ.) Four people responded with various answers not related to heaven. **Two individuals desired a follow-up conversation.**
