<u>2022 in Brief:</u> Responses—Volunteers logged miles and hours responding to the Kentucky Tornado Relief (Dec. 2021 - Jan. 2022), the Natoma, KS, Prairie Fire Recovery (Dec. 2021 - Jan. 2022), and the Andover Tornado Recovery (May 2022).

Some volunteers spent days and even weeks helping to clean up after these natural disasters, not to mention the hours they volunteered for local events in their own congregations and communities. We are eternally grateful to these volunteers for their time spent, miles traveled, and equipment provided to aid in these devastated communities.



Linn Lutheran School Auction Fundraiser a Great Success!



Participants gathered for the annual Linn Lutheran School Endowment Fund auction fundraiser on Nov. 19.

The annual Linn Lutheran School Endowment Fund auction fundraiser raised over a quarter of a million dollars this year, setting another record! The fundraiser was held on Nov. 19 at the Palmer Community Building, and included live and silent auctions and a meal. The fundraiser raised \$273,281.94 for the endowment fund.

The Linn Lutheran School Endowment Fund was created in 2007 to provide an avenue for supporters of

the school and Christian education to financially secure the future of the school "so that your values and legacy of Christian faith will live on and further God's work for generations to come."

"We have a very generous community that supports parochial education," said Terry Ohlde, who chairs the endowment fund committee. "The support comes from inside and outside our association churches. It is a fun event and people look forward to going to it and supporting it."

A portion of the auction event proceeds goes to Linn Lutheran School's annual budget, and the remainder goes to the endowment fund. Linn Lutheran School includes grades 1-8 and two preschool classes. Due to increasing enrollment at the school over the last few years, a fourth teacher was added for the primary grades, and a building addition was constructed for more classroom space. Herren Memorial Fund Matching Facility Improvement Grants

There is a unique grant opportunity available to Kansas District congregations, schools, and RSO's to receive matching funds for money raised to support a building project or facility needs. This special grant comes from the Dr. Charles and Vivian Herren Memorial Fund, and the LCMS Kansas District. The funds will be awarded on a matching basis. This means that for every dollar you raise between \$15,000-\$40,000 you could be awarded matching funds for your building improvement or project. Grant requests may be fully funded, partially funded, or denied, based on information available on the grant application as well as availability of funding, which is limited.

This matching grant applies to construction projects in process or completed during 2022 for which new dollars continue to be raised, or projects to begin in 2023. Jesus Poor-2-Poor

On Saturday, December 10, seven people representing two LCMS congregations gathered at St. John Lutheran in Palmer

and canvassed the town of Clifton. The group knocked on 98 doors. 46 people answered the door, and 23 of them agreed to take the survey. Gospel and congregational literature was left at the 52 houses where no one was home.

When asked, "Where do you believe you will go when you die?" 19 people responded with "heaven," but only 10 believed they would get there because of Jesus Christ.

Three people answered, "I don't know," and one person said, "reincarnation." Nine out of the 23 people (39%) who took the survey said they did not currently attend a church. When asked the question, "What is your favorite Bible story?" there were a variety of responses. Some mentioned the account of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, while others listed Jonah, Ruth, Jesus' conception and resurrection, the Christmas story, Moses and water from the rock, and the book of Psalms.
