March Devotion

Fellow members of the Body of Christ,

"I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now" (Philippians 1:3-5).

I shared these words with you in my email announcement that I was accepting the call to the Synod. I've also shared them with you plenty of

other times over the last handful of years. As I reflected on what to write in my last communication in *Workers Together*, I kept coming back to these words. While I have given some thought to that part "from the first day until now," considering I've only served in Kansas since my time at the seminary and I've known some of you for decades, I'm especially reflecting on the words "your partnership in the gospel."

My 20 years in Kansas has been a blessing for me. But there were times when I did my work as a pastor of a congregation without thinking about working in partnership with the larger church. You know how that goes. Life gets busy. Ministry can be hard. And you're just trying to keep all the plates spinning.

However, my time on staff for the Kansas District has given me a new appreciation for these words "partnership in the gospel." How applicable those words are to the role I have filled in the KSD for the last six years. **Because without your partnership, nothing would have been done.**

If you didn't welcome me into your congregations for Mission and Stewardship Sundays, I wouldn't have been able to reinforce what you had been trying to say for years. (Everyone knows that all it takes to be an expert is to live more than 50 miles away.) If you didn't pass the word on about Pentecost Offering appeals, we wouldn't have been able to build a seminary in Guinea and support mission work in that part of the world. If you didn't allow me to visit with your people, we wouldn't have been able to raise awareness about Campus Ministry, Church Planting efforts in places like De Soto and Concordia, and Multi-Ethnic Ministry, especially in Kansas City. If you didn't allow me to join your Winkels (although sometimes reluctantly), I wouldn't have been able to connect with you members of the KSD. If you didn't invite me to do chapels at your schools, I wouldn't have been able to talk to young people about God's Mission and how they can be involved.

After serving in this role, I recognize that it does take a partnership, as it should be in the Kingdom of God. I needed you to invite me in and host me so that I could do the work that God had called me to do.

So, thank you! Thank you for your partnership in the Gospel. Thank you for your invitations and hospitality. Thank you for allowing me the opportunity to try and do what the staff of the Kansas District is supposed to do!

The KSD mission is to support and encourage the members of the District in carrying out the mission Christ has given His Church. As this mission statement makes clear, we can't do anything without you. I pray that you would continue to carry out that mission given to you in Baptism, and as called workers of the LCMS Kansas District. I'm sure that President Panzer and the rest of the staff will be ready to support you in the days and years to come.

The Lord's blessings to you all until we see each other again. **The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you!**

Lutheran Early Response Team (LERT) News

In Kansas, we understand the unpredictability of year-round weather patterns. **"Prepare to Adapt"** is the theme for any type of Disaster Response.

Are you equipped to step into the spring storm season? There are a myriad of resources available to help you assess your current and future preparedness and needs, both personal and within your church buildings.

Here is a list of resources for you to tap into as you prepare for storm season in Kansas:

- Weather.gov/top/swaw. Resources include Kansas Weather Spotters Field Guide and the 2023 Kansas Severe Weather Preparedness Packet.
- Connect with your local County, Township and/or City Emergency Management office. Many will be scheduling Storm Spotter classes in the coming weeks. Most are free to attend and do not require an RSVP.
- Severe Weather Week: March 6-10, 2023
- National Emergency Preparedness Month: Sept. 2023

If you do not have a Severe Weather plan at your church, make one. You never know when a storm might develop. Be prepared for all times the church building may be in use.

Not sure where to start? Invite your local Emergency Manager to help you assess your building and the best course of action, including multiple storm shelter options. And, if you don't have a weather radio in your building, you might consider purchasing one.

Equally important is your Severe Weather plan at home. Do you have a plan and does everyone understand it? Do you practice it? A few minutes of preparation could matter in the event you must take immediate shelter.

In the event of a destructive storm or critical event, do you have a list of resources to call to request help? Prioritize your list and be intentional in updating and distributing your list to those responsible for taking the lead on any cleanup or recovery effort. Be sure to include the District Office (President Panzer) and your DDRC (Donna Williams) on your list. LERT teams respond through these contacts.

If you have questions and/or would like to schedule a visit (new or established teams) or inquire about scheduling or attending a LERT Basic Training or Basic Chainsaw Safety Class, please contact your Kansas District Disaster Response Coordinator, **Donna Williams**, ksddrc@gmail.com or (316) 641-0332.

Concordia Seminary, St. Louis: 2023 Multiethnic Symposium

The thematic emphasis of the **2023 Multiethnic Symposium** is "Hope for the Church, Hope for the Future: 1.5 and 2.0 Generation Immigrants," set for **May 2-3** on the campus of Concordia Seminary, St. Louis.

Participants will explore the challenges of 1.5 and 2.0 generation neighbors and embrace their contributions to the life of the church today — and for generations to come. The annual symposium brings together missional leaders including pastors, congregational lay leaders and others from across The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS). The symposium explores what it means and what it will take to become a truly multiethnic church.

For at least 20-25 years the Kansas District has requested "exceptions" for several of its circuits when selecting delegates to the Synod Conventions. The circuits affected have been primarily in Kansas City and the western and north central parts of the state. The reason for requesting "exceptions" is that the number of congregations and/or communicant members in these circuits is out of sync with Synod Bylaw 3.1.2 (a) requirements: "7 to 20 member congregations, involving an aggregate confirmed membership ranging from 1,500 to 10,000" (2019 Handbook, p. 99).

In response to the "exceptions" granted, the Kansas District communicated with the Synod that circuit realignment would occur at the 2025 Kansas District Convention. In November 2022, the District Board of Directors passed **Resolution 22D-06-07 – Establish Task Force to Develop Circuit Realignment Recommendations**

Whereas, a number of circuits in the Kansas District do not meet the minimum requirements for representation to the Synod Convention and received exceptions for the 2023 Convention, and

Whereas, the Kansas District Board of Directors, when requesting exceptions for the 2023 Convention, told the Synod that circuit realignment would occur at the 2025 Kansas District Convention, therefore be it

Resolved, that the Board of Directors authorize the District President, in consultation with the President's Council, to appoint a task force for circuit realignment to assess the situation and make circuit realignment recommendations to the 2025 Kansas District Convention.

President Panzer appointed a Circuit Realignment Committee consisting of Pastors Mark Schulz (Region 1 VP), Alan Stahlecker (Region 2 VP), Michael Schotte (Region 3 VP), Michael Hageman (Region 4 VP), Andy Keltner (Chairman of the Circuit Visitors), and Joshua Woelmer (District Secretary).

The committee is taking the approach that its primary work will be to coordinate and communicate with the District, rather than to put forward a solution without thorough communication with and input from the affected circuits. Additional communication will follow on a regular basis. Watch for further details.
