## **President's Office**

## **June/July Devotion**

We are the "royal priests of Christ." That's not my own madeup term. Christ calls you that in 1 Peter 2:9. "But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood..." Baptism brings us into a salvation relationship with God. We now "share in a heavenly calling" with Him to the priesthood in Baptism.

What does a royal priest of God do? We sacrifice. We pray. We are taught. We worship. We are connected together in a common confession and faith. Our efforts have meaning and value because of Christ. His ultimate sacrifice on the Cross prompts all the sacrifices of the royal priesthood. And we certainly have a great charge in front of us – to be His salt and light in this world. It is the privilege and joy of every believer to faithfully share Christ with others through our own words and deeds. We are eager to be in worship and Bible study and devotion, so that we might be ready to give an answer to those who ask the reason for the hope that lives within us. As long as God allows us to live on this earth, there will be service that is needed, and there will be people who need to be served.

## **Herren Grant Funds Distributed**

The Kansas District was blessed to receive monies from the Herren Family designated towards "brick and mortar" projects totaling \$200,000. The Kansas District Board of Directors used unrestricted dollars to match the amount. Congregations, schools, and RSOs of the LCMS Kansas District were eligible to apply. **Thirty-four** (34) total applications for over \$1.1 million dollars were received.

The committee considered all the grant applications, the funding requested, as well as the available funding. We would have liked to have fully funded, or at least, partially funded, all of the requests. Unfortunately, we weren't able to do this. Eight projects were left unfunded. Maximum grants of up to \$25,000 were awarded, along with minimum grant amounts of \$15,000 per the LCMS Foundation guidelines. **May God continue to bless the work of our congregations, schools, and RSOs of the LCMS Kansas District!**





## **Concordia Academy - Wichita New Residency Programs**

Concordia Academy - Wichita (CAW) is offering a new residency program called "Orbis Concordiae, The World of Concordia." The goal of this program is for CAW to reach out to families and students outside the Wichita area, and include other areas of Kansas.

Students participating in the program would attend on campus classes for a week at a time, staying with volunteer families from local LCMS churches. During non-residency weeks (2-3 weeks at a time), students would be at home attending virtual classes; 1 synchronous participation class per subject per week. These virtual classes would allow for assignments to be submitted via email or through an online bulletin board.

"Concordia This Week" is a once weekly interactive session offered both virtually and in-person to parents to better work together with homeschooling efforts. Tuition for five or more classes per student will be \$6,000/year while students enrolled in 1-4 classes will be \$4,000/year per student.






# The Congregation at Prayer Resources Available!
