- In October 2022, six parcels of land were purchased for the future construction and home of the CLET-Guinea seminary.
- In May 2022, five students successfully completed the academic cycle of basic theological formation.
- Six villages and over 1,000 people were served in the Guéckédou and N'zérékoré regions through improvement of drinking wells and construction of latrines.

The LCMS Kansas District is seeking qualified candidates for the position of Executive to the District President for Congregational and School Services. Applicants shall be on the ordained clergy roster of Synod, having had a minimum of five years' experience (10 preferred) in professional church work; a major portion of this experience having been in the parish.

Preferred candidates have been a pastor in a congregation with a school. Knowledge, skills and abilities required shall be determined at the time of call. The man called to this position shall be required to enroll in the School Leadership Development Project (SLED) over two summers if he does not have a school background.
