On April 13, **49 people** from five different LCMS congregations gathered at Hope Lutheran Church in Shawnee for a Jesus Door-2-Door (JD2D) event.

After canvassing training, participants divided into 10 teams to canvass the neighborhood. The teams knocked on 212 doors. 78 people

answered the door, and 49 took the survey.

13 people (26%) were unchurched. 16 (33%) were unfamiliar with Hope Lutheran Church and School. When asked, "Where do you believe you will go when you die?" 40 people responded with "Heaven," but only 26 were sure it was because of what

Jesus Christ did for them.

The Gospel was shared with 47 people, and one individual requested a follow-up visit!

A good gift plan within one's estate plan can help manage taxation. For an extended period, Federal Estate Taxation exemptions (how much is exempt from Federal Estate Tax) have been high. In 2024 it is set at \$13.6 million per person, or \$27.2 million per couple. For most of us that is not a concern. However, some states have estate or inheritance taxes. In addition, retirement plans like annuities, IRAs' or 401(K)'s can be loaded with income tax liability. If you are planning on making a charitable gift to your favorite ministry from your estate, you want to make sure you use the right asset to reduce this liability.



Annual Report Filing Frequency Changed

Good news! The Kansas Secretary of State has changed the filing frequency for business annual reports from annually to biannually.

Churches and schools incorporated in Kansas will now be required to file Form INP every two years. Filing years will be determined by formation documents on file with the Kansas Secretary of State. If a ministry was formed in an even year, they will file every even year. If a ministry was formed in an odd year, they will file every odd year.
