




"There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch





from his roots shall bear fruit. And the Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord."

(Isaiah 11:1-2)

"Get back to your roots." It's a simple phrase that means we must consider who we are through appreciating our past and the meaning of our history.

But most people are cut off from their past. That rootlessness is often magnified at Christmas, and especially for people who have been uprooted from their immediate families, whether by divorce, distance or conflict. Traditional human connections are the stuff of real, daily life. We may dismiss our past by describing it as "baggage" or "issues." This is true when we feel that our past or our family history is embarrassing, too humble or even too foreign.

But even our Lord Jesus Christ had a root, a source, a history. His source from eternity was His heavenly Father from whom He was ever begotten, without beginning or end. Late in time, He comes as the offspring of the Virgin's womb. He comes from the root of Jesse. Isaiah was intending to say that the sign of the King's return is humble, unexpected, even foreign. No one

looks at the shoot that comes from the root of Jesse and declares His glory, or names Him King. His roots do not attract us to Him. He is of the cut down house of Jesse.

Christ is not rootless. He comes from humble, human stock. His roots tell us how much like us He is. Our Lord is true man born of the Virgin Mary. He comes from God as God of God. His root is fixed in eternity. He comes from God and returns to God so that we might know who is born of Mary and comes from the stump of Jesse. It is good for us to know what our roots really are. If we are in Him, then we are rooted in God.

Martin Luther writes:

"His resting place shall be glorious" (Isaiah 11:10) that is, death, the end of life, the departure from this life. The death of all other kings is the end of their reign. But Christ will reign gloriously from His death forward, and this signifies His resur-

rection from the dead. In Psalm 8:4 we read: "What is man, etc.?" The prophet calls death a rest and cessation from labors, glory after shame. To the world He seems dead and mute and inglorious. But He lives and reigns in glory. Therefore, we have three elements here: (1) the raising of the ensign through the gospel; (2) the act of seeking, receiving, and believing; (3) the object of faith, the Root, that is, Christ, who reigns though dead. When the prophets speak of Christ's reign, they speak of His humanity and of His divinity. The Root of Jesse points to the man. The fact that the nations seek Him shows that He is God. Earlier the prophet wrote: "Should not a people inquire of their God" (Isaiah 8:19)? Glory and faithfulness belong to God alone, who alone helps and saves."



The LCMS-U campus ministry at Trinity Lutheran Church in Garden City has a small pocket of influence on Garden City Community College's campus, which has proven to have eternal implications.

For the last two years Trinity has returned their focus on making known they are a place for young adults to be enlightened by the gifts that Christ delivers. With a handful of college age Lutherans and their friends, Trinity has been gathering around God's Word and applying it to the challenges college students are facing.

## **Campus Ministry Garden City**

The equation is simple – Trinity invites and connects these individuals to ministries that are already in place and connects them to older adults who enjoy being around college-aged adults. These connections happen at weekly Wednesday midweek studies and Sunday morning worship. Young adults and church members also gather once a month on Sunday evenings at Rev. Michael Hageman's house for "Table Talk," where the group discusses the Augsburg Confession and closes the night by chanting Compline.

Recently on All Saints Sunday a student from the college was confirmed in the faith after spending much of his life in the Mennonite community. To God be the Glory!

## **Jesus Door-2-Door**

On Nov. 16, Rev. Timothy Koch (pastor of Zion, Linn) took six youth from three different LCMS Kansas District congregations to a Jesus Door-2-Door event at Concordia University in Seward, Neb. The Kansas group met up with people from Wisconsin, South Dakota, Nebraska, California, and Mongolia (yes ... the country!)

After icebreakers, a Bible study and witnessing training, the group canvassed the community in eight teams (three teams to Utica, Neb., and five teams to York, Neb.) The teams knocked on 190 homes. 80 people answered the door and 56 agreed to take the survey. Of those 56, 10 people (18%) were unchurched. Five of the 56 people (9%) replied, "I don't know" when asked, "Where do you believe you will go when you die?"

Through the groups' canvassing efforts, two people desired a follow-up visit from the local congregations (one individual lived in Utica, and the other in York).

## **Parish Nurse Ministry**

**December is Safe Toy Month!** It's the Christmas season and we remember our children. Before a child receives a new toy, it's important to stop and consider if it is safe and age appropriate. Thousands of children are hurt each year due to unsafe or developmentally inappropriate toys.

Toys that can be swallowed and cause airway obstruction is one of the leading causes of death in children. Their trachea is extremely narrow, and even the tiniest piece from a toy can block a child's airway and cause suffocation. Also, make sure crayons and markers are labeled "nontoxic." Toys with removable magnets or "button" batteries can cause serious injuries or even death if they are ingested

Keep in mind the child's age and development level when giving toys. If shopping for infants and children with special needs, look for toys that appeal to the senses. Let this be a safe Christmas!

# **Corporate Transparency Act and Scam Forms**

The Corporate Transparency Act (CTA) is a recently enacted federal law effective January 1, 2024, which requires corporate entities to disclose information regarding their beneficial owners and controlling individuals. 501(c)(3) organizations, including church entities, are exempt from filing the CTA report.

With the new act in place, many businesses, organizations, and individuals are receiving "official-looking" forms from entities who are not a federal agency. An example that has come to my attention is a mailing titled "Form 5102 Mandatory Beneficial Ownership Reporting," from either Annual Records Service or Records Management Service with a filing fee of \$119. These forms are a fraudulent attempt to get information and payment; the correspondence is not from a governmental agency. There is also no legitimate fee associated with filing a CTA report.

If your church receives correspondence similar to this, remember that churches are exempt from the CTA and that these forms are a scam. Do <u>not</u> fill out these forms and do <u>not</u> remit payment.


