



The LCMS-U campus ministry at Trinity Lutheran Church in Garden City has a small pocket of influence on Garden City Community College's campus, which has proven to have eternal implications.

For the last two years Trinity has returned their focus on making known they are a place for young adults to be enlightened by the gifts that Christ delivers. With a handful of college age Lutherans and their friends, Trinity has been gathering around God's Word and applying it to the challenges college students are facing.

Campus Ministry Garden City

The equation is simple – Trinity invites and connects these individuals to ministries that are already in place and connects them to older adults who enjoy being around college-aged adults. These connections happen at weekly Wednesday midweek studies and Sunday morning worship. Young adults and church members also gather once a month on Sunday evenings at Rev. Michael Hageman's house for "Table Talk," where the group discusses the Augsburg Confession and closes the night by chanting Compline.

Recently on All Saints Sunday a student from the college was confirmed in the faith after spending much of his life in the Mennonite community. To God be the Glory!

On Saturday, December 14, Rev. Timothy Koch (pastor of Zion, Linn), six youth and three adults traveled to Immanuel Lutheran Church in Lincoln, NE, for a JD2D event.

Six canvassing teams knocked on 156 homes. 31 people agreed to take the canvassing survey. One of the questions asked was, "Where do you believe you will go when you die?" The teams received the following answers:

"Heaven" (23 people); "Reincarnation" (three people);

"Ground" (one person); "I don't know" (one person); "20% heaven, 80% hell" (one person), and two people didn't answer the question.

this role of Assistant to the Kansas District President for Education & Youth has been an incredible joy and an honor!



Middle School Huddle


Join us for the 2025 Middle School Huddle (MSH) taking place on **April 4-5**, **2025**, at

Kansas Lutheran Schools Scholarship Foundation Approved to Participate in Scholarship Program

Topeka, Kansas, December 2, 2024 – At its November 12-13, 2024, meeting, the Kansas State Board of Education officially recognized the **Kansas Lutheran Schools Scholarship Foundation, Inc.,** of Topeka, Kansas, as an approved Scholarship Granting Organization (SGO), meeting all the statutory requirements for participation in the "Tax Credit for Low Income Student Scholarship Program."

The Kansas Lutheran Schools Scholarship Foundation (KLSSF) is a newly incorporated non-profit organization in the State of Kansas. It was formed at the request of the LCMS Kansas District Board of Directors for the benefit of K-12 LCMS schools in Kansas. It a separate entity of the LCMS Kansas District with its own governing board and officers. The KLSSF is also an IRS-designated 501(c)(3) charitable organization, which means that donations to the foundation are tax-deductible.

The sole purpose of the KLSSF is to serve as a Scholarship Granting Organization under the provisions of the Kansas Tax Credit for Low Income Students Scholarship Program for participating qualified K-12 LCMS schools in Kansas. Under the provisions of the program, individuals and businesses with a state tax liability are eligible to donate up to \$500,000 and receive a 75% tax credit.

Once a donation is received, the KLSSF must use

at least 90% of it to provide up to \$8,000 in scholarships for students at the lowest income levels to attend an accredited K-12 LCMS school in Kansas. Foundation staff will process the donation with the Kansas Department of Revenue to secure your 75% state income tax credit.

Reflecting on the vital mission of our K-12 LCMS schools in Kansas, **Rev. Justin Panzer**, President of the LCMS Kansas District suggested: "Your contribution to the KLSSF provides educational scholarships to qualifying students so that they can receive a high-quality Lutheran, Christian education. Lutheran education is important because its focus is on the most important thing: helping students' faith in Jesus grow and develop. Educators in Lutheran schools teach students about Jesus while they prepare students to live out the purpose that God has planned for them. Prayerfully consider what you can do to help support our Kansas District LCMS Lutheran schools as they seek to serve the children of their communities."

State Representative **Kenny Titus** and Board President of the KLSSF offered this encouragement to considering a donation: "Educating our children has been a historical priority for LCMS congregations and the need is greater now than at any time in the past. As the culture rejects our fundamental Christian values and the cost to our churches for providing education increases every year, supporting the Kansas

Interested donors should consult with their CPA or tax advisor about their expected state tax liability for the year and their eligibility to claim the credit. Donations dated and postmarked 12/31/2024 or earlier will be considered 2024 donations.

Who is the Kansas Lutheran Schools Scholarship Foundation?

- ♦ The KLSSF is a 501(c)(3) non-profit charitable organization.
- ◆ The LCMS Kansas District Board of Directors encouraged the formation of the KLSSF to support LCMS schools in the Kansas District.

Overview of the Kansas Tax Credit Scholarship Program

- ◆ Receive a 75% Tax Credit on your Donation!
- Annual donation limit of \$500,000
- ◆ Individuals and Businesses with a state tax liability may contribute.
- \$10 million in credits are available per year.
- ♦ 14 K-12 Lutheran schools in Kansas.
- Donate for a specific school (unless there are no eligible students at that particular school).
- 90% of each donation is used to fund scholarships.

What Happens to the Donation?

- ♦ KLSSF uses it to provide scholarships for students at the lowest income levels to attend an accredited K-12 LCMS school in Kansas.
- ◆ The KLSSF will process your donation with the Kansas Department of Revenue and secure your 75% state income tax credit.

What are the Advantages of Making a Donation?

- Reduce or eliminate your state tax liability.
- Donors that itemize may also be eligible to claim a partial charitable contribution deduction on their federal income taxes.

Parish Nurse Ministry

January is designated as **National Blood Donor Month.** Because of the holiday celebrations, inclement weather, and seasonal illnesses, the winter months are often a time of reduced donations and an increased need for blood transfusions, causing a shortage at the blood centers and hospitals.

Do you know your blood type? For your health record, it is good to have the information. The types of blood are A, B, AB and O, with each being either negative or positive. Type O is considered the universal donor and is the most common at 44% of the population, followed by type A at approximately 42%. Type B is less common at 10%, and type AB is the least common at around 4%. Blood donation centers are readily available in any major city and often there is a mobile unit available for donations. Make an appointment, it feels good to help others!

Corporate Transparency Act and Scam Forms

The Corporate Transparency Act (CTA) is a recently enacted federal law effective January 1, 2024, which requires corporate entities to disclose information regarding their beneficial owners and controlling individuals. 501(c)(3) organizations, including church entities, are exempt from filing the CTA report.

With the new act in place, many businesses, organizations, and individuals are receiving "official-looking" forms from entities who are not a federal agency. An example that has come to my attention is a mailing titled "Form 5102 Mandatory Beneficial Ownership Reporting," from either Annual Records Service or Records Management Service with a filing fee of \$119. These forms are a fraudulent attempt to get information and payment; the correspondence is not from a governmental agency. There is also no legitimate fee associated with filing a CTA report.

If your church receives correspondence similar to this, remember that churches are exempt from the CTA and that these forms are a scam. Do <u>not</u> fill out these forms and do <u>not</u> remit payment.


