
Announcements and Reminders



"Return to the Lord Your God" (v. 13). God's people are not to just go through the motions of repentance. The prophet expects that they will let the Word sink into their hearts and consciences. He expects that the visible signs, fasting and weeping and mourning, will follow. Joel takes the very core of our self-idolatry and throws it away. The Lord calls His wandering people home through the Word. Let the law of Your holy God humble your pride and lead you to contrition, even though your broken heart may hurt. True repentance is appalled at sin because sin separates us from the Lord. And true repentance includes faith in the promised foraiveness of sins.

When Joel speaks God's Word, he describes the God who has compassion and love for His people. *"He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love" (v. 13).* This is how God describes Himself. He is jealous for His people yet full of compassion, not wanting anyone to perish.

The mark of the ashes and the sign of the cross is placed on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday. Ashes remind us of our mortality in this life and of why we need a Savior – to rescue us from this present, evil age, and to bring us

Devotion

I invite the people of the LCMS Kansas District to once again join together on Ash Wednesday for a Districtwide "**Day of Repentance**." We encourage you to pray the Litany, worship, fast, and give a financial contribution to your local congregation.

What is a fast? How does it fit in with what the Lord is trying to teach us as He calls us to repentance? If you have access to *The Lutheran Study Bible*, turn to page 189, where you'll find a helpful article called, "When You Fast" (also available online on the *First Things* blog). Note especially these words:

"During the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus spoke against fasting as a means of salvation. Instead, **He commended fasting as a private, voluntary act of humility before** (Matt. 6:16-18). Take a few moments now to read His words and reflect on your own devotion. If you are like most people, you have thought more about dieting than fasting. It is hard to imagine a day-

"Yet even now," declares the Lord, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning." (Joel 2:12)

> long fast. No doubt fasting for 40 days like Jesus did after His baptism is out of the question. Yet our Lord's words clearly reveal that fasting should be part of a Christian's life: He said, "When you fast" (Matt. 6:16), not "If you fast" (cf. Matt. 9:14-15). The early Christians fasted (Acts 13:2-3; 14:23). Why shouldn't a 21stcentury Christian do likewise?"

A simple fast might involve going without one or two meals before receiving the Lord's Supper and using the time to focus on God's Word. If skipping a meal isn't an option, think about taking a break from something else, like social media or web surfing. Whatever form it takes, fasting is a powerful reminder of Christ's own obedience and sacrifice for us all.

Our Lord wants you to return to Him what is His in the first place. Everything belongs to the Lord, we only get to borrow it for a time. Everything we give back to Him belongs to Him. It never was ours.

"Return to me," the Lord invites through His prophet Joel (2:12) ... with your whole life. God bless our worship of Him, especially during the season of Lent! Trinity Lutheran Church & Preschool, Garden City

On February 8, **27 people** from seven different LCMS churches representing four states (*Kan., Mo., Fla., Ill.*) and two countries (*U.S. and Latvia*) gathered at Hope Lutheran Church & School in Shawnee for a Jesus Door-2-Door (JD2D) event.

The group divided into nine canvassing teams and knocked on 199 homes (*skipping over an additional 87 homes with "No Soliciting" signs.*) Sixty-five people answered the door and 36 people agreed to take the survey.

Of those who took the canvassing survey, 16 (44%) were unchurched, 21 (58%) were unfamiliar with Hope Lutheran Church & School, and 13 (36%) were confident of their salvation on account of Jesus Christ.

Through the group's canvassing efforts, two (5%) individuals desired a follow-up visit from Hope Lutheran Church, as well as a gentleman who desired additional information about Hope Lutheran School. Please keep Hope Lutheran Church & School in your prayers!





OUR MISSION

The mission of the Kansas Lutheran Schools Scholarship Foundation (KLSSF) is to provide life-changing scholarships, empowering families to access quality Lutheran education and fostering Christ-centered academic excellence across Kansas.

OUR PURPOSE

To provide scholarships for children attending K-12 Lutheran schools of the LCMS Kansas District, under the provisions of the Kansas Tax Credit Scholarship program.

ELIGIBILITY

- New students to a LCMS school in Kansas who are either entering kindergarten, or transferring from a public school.
- Family income is 250% of federal poverty guidelines or less.

HOW TO APPLY

 A parent or guardian completes an application through the Kansas State Board of Education website by June 1. Visit <u>https://www.ksde.gov/Agency/</u> <u>Fiscal-and-Administrative-Services/</u> <u>School-Finance/Tax-Credit-for-Low-</u> <u>Income-Students-Scholarship-</u> <u>Program/Online-Application</u> to fill out the online application.

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

- The amount of the scholarship awarded will be determined annually by a number of factors including the amount of donated funds available and the number of eligible applicants.
- By law, scholarships cannot exceed \$8,000 and can be used to cover tuition and other education-related expenses.
- If the tuition charged does not cover the cost to educate, the school must publicize that number along with its annual tuition rates.

SCHOLARSHIP PAYMENTS

Scholarships will be paid directly to the school by August 1, before each academic year.

75 percent

Donations may be eligible for a 75 percent credit on state income tax liability. Unused credits can be carried over.

90 percent

KANSAS SEVERE WEATHER AWARENESS WEEK will be held March 3-7, 2025, with the STATEWIDE TORNADO DRILL on March 5. This is a good time to review your evacuation or shelter plans and practices in your churches. If you don't have a plan in place, contact your local Emergency Management office and see if there is someone who can walk through your building with you and make recommendations.

WEATHER RADIOS: Do you have a Weather Radio in your church building? If not, you might consider purchasing one that can be accessed any time your building is in use. This is one more layer of preparation for our unpredictable Kansas weather. Storm clean-up in North Carolina is still ongoing. Deployments are scheduled through July 2025. Parish Nurse Ministry

Regular eye exams can catch problems before it is too late. The American Academy of Ophthalmology recommends having a vision screening each year after the age of 40. It is an essential step toward preserving vision and keeping eyes healthy. More than 43 million Americans are at risk for significant vision loss or blindness from age-related eye diseases, such as cataracts, diabetic retinopathy, glaucoma, and macular degeneration.

The first step in preventing vision loss is to get a baseline eye exam at the age of 40. This is the age when early signs of eye disease and changes in vision may first occur. For individuals at any age with symptoms of, or at risk for, eye disease, such as those with a family history of eye disease, diabetes or high blood pressure, the Academy recommends seeing your ophthalmologist to determine how frequently your eyes should be examined. Based on the results of the initial screening, your ophthalmologist will prescribe the necessary intervals for follow-up exams.

Scholarships Available!

Our LCMS congregations and schools need church workers, and the Kansas District is ready and willing to help. The District is once again offering scholarships to students pursuing a degree in church work at one of the Synod's universities or seminaries. Last year the Kansas District awarded \$66,353 in scholarships to future church workers!

Caylen McCoy, who is currently a student at Concordia University Nebraska, shared a thank-you to the Kansas District for continued financial support:

"I thank God often for the amazing gift of your support. It allows me to attend the perfect university to equip me for my calling and the Christian life, so that I may show the depth of the wonders of God to my future family and congregation, thereby enriching their lives in turn. Thank you for your continued prayers, and I pray for you in your lives and callings, and in your duties of stewardship."

Scholarship amounts are based on available funds and the number of applications received. **The application deadline for 2025-26 scholarships is June 1.** The application is available on the District website, <u>https:// kslcms.org/kansas-district-stewardship/educationgrants</u>.

Corporate Transparency Act and Scam Forms

The Corporate Transparency Act (CTA) is a recently enacted federal law effective January 1, 2024, which requires corporate entities to disclose information regarding their beneficial owners and controlling individuals. *501(c)(3)* organizations, including church entities, are exempt from filing the CTA report.

With the new act in place, many businesses, organizations, and individuals are receiving "official-looking" forms from entities who are not a federal agency. An example that has come to my attention is a mailing titled "Form 5102 Mandatory Beneficial Ownership Reporting," from either Annual Records Service or Records Management Service with a filing fee of \$119. These forms are a fraudulent attempt to get information and payment; the correspondence is not from a governmental agency. There is also no legitimate fee associated with filing a CTA report.

If your church receives correspondence similar to this, remember that churches are exempt from the CTA and that these forms are a scam. Do <u>not</u> fill out these forms and do <u>not</u> remit payment.

2025 IRS Mileage Rate

Effective January 1, 2025: The IRS new mileage rates are 70¢ per mile for business and 21¢ per mile for medical.

The Kansas District mileage rate, set by the Board of Directors, is 15 cents below the IRS rate, or 55¢ per mile. These new rates apply to mileage reimbursements paid to an employee on or after January 1, 2025, with respect to transportation expenses paid or incurred by the employee on or after January 1, 2025. The rate used for charitable deduction purposes remains at 14¢ per mile.
