"While [Jesus] blessed them, he parted from them and was carried up into heaven. And they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and were continually in the temple blessing God."

(Luke 24:51-53)

Ascension Day is always on a Thursday 40 days after Easter (Acts 1:3). This year, it falls on May 29. The bodily ascension of

Christ back to the right hand of His Father is one of great joy. Why? Because of His death and resurrection, Jesus guarantees that our salvation is complete and secure. Hebrews 1:3b, "After making purification for sins, [Jesus] sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high."

Jesus now rules the world for the sake of His Church. Ephesians 1:20, 22, "[God the Father] seated [Christ] at his right hand in the heavenly places ... And he put all things under his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church."

Jesus is praying for us. Romans 8:34, "Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us."

Finally, Jesus is still present with us. Matthew 28:20b, "And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Yes, our salvation is complete

and secure in Christ. He is King over all things for the sake of His Church. He is now interceding for us before the throne of His Father. And, He is with us now in Word and Sacrament to forgive our sins and strengthen our faith. Worship this Christ on Ascension Day. After all, it is one of the major festivals of the Church Year!

"For in Him the divine and the human nature are personally united with one another, so that in Christ dwelleth all the fullness of the Godhead bodily, Col. 2:9, and in this personal union have such a sublime, intimate, ineffable communion that even the angels are astonished at it, and, as St. Peter testifies, have their delight and joy in looking into it [1 Pet. 1:12]; all of which will shortly be explained in order and somewhat more fully." Matthew Vatthauer (CSL) is the associate pastoral candidate to St. Paul, Clay Center.



Last year, \$50,000 was given to sustain the work of the Centre Luthérien d'Études Théologiques (CLET) seminary in Guinea. This year's Pentecost Offering will continue to help support the CLET-Guinea seminary, as well as the provision of Lutheran education and resources to the people of Guinea and West Africa.

Other West Africa updates include reports of The Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church in Sierra Leone celebrating new seminary graduates; a growing number of seminarians and deaconess trainees currently being trained at the Lutheran Theological Seminary in Ghana, and seminary students at the Jonathan Ekong Memorial Lutheran Seminary in Nigeria manage a fish farm for their own meals, to increase support from the LCMS.

Jesus Door-2-Door

On Saturday, April 26, **Trinity Lutheran Church in Holton** hosted a Jesus Door-2-Door (JD2D) event, where seven individuals from two LCMS congregations gathered. A Bible study over Proverbs 18:1-16 was discussed, and afterwards the group broke into three teams to canvass an area of Holton. Altogether, the groups knocked on 63 doors. 25 people answered the door, and 22 of them agreed to take the survey. Eight people (36%) who took the survey were unchurched. Only 10 (45%) were confident of their salvation because of what Jesus did for them.



OUR MISSION

The Kansas Lutheran Schools Scholarship Foundation provides life-changing scholarships to eligible students, empowering families to access quality Lutheran education and fostering Christ-centered academic excellence across Kansas.

OUR PURPOSE

To provide scholarships for children attending K-12 Lutheran schools of the LCMS Kansas District, under the provisions of the Kansas Tax Credit Scholarship program.

ELIGIBILITY

- New students to a LCMS school in Kansas who are either entering kindergarten, or transferring from a public school.
- Family income is 250% of federal poverty guidelines or less.

HOW TO APPLY

 A parent or guardian completes an application through the Kansas State Board of Education website by June 1. Visit https://www.ksde.gov/Agency/Fiscal-and-Administrative-Services/School-Finance/Tax-Credit-for-Low-Income-Students-Scholarship-Program/Online-Application to fill out the online application.

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

- The amount of the scholarship awarded will be determined annually by a number of factors including the amount of donated funds available and the number of eligible applicants.
- By law, scholarships cannot exceed \$8,000 and can be used to cover tuition and other education-related expenses.
- If the tuition charged does not cover the cost to educate, the school must publicize that number along with its annual tuition rates.

SCHOLARSHIP PAYMENTS

Scholarships will be paid directly to the school by August 1, before each academic year.

75 percent

Donations may be eligible for a 75 percent credit on state income tax liability. Unused credits can be carried over.

90 percent

By state law, at least 90 percent of your donation must be used to grant scholarships up to \$8,000.

Recently several states experienced severe weather outbreaks that included multiple tornadoes ranging from EF1 to EF4. These storms were unprecedented for several reasons and caused widespread damage, and sadly, injury and loss of life. "Prepare to Adapt" to our everchanging weather patterns. I hope you will continue to look to the needs of your family, church and community and create ways to be involved in preparedness in the event of a severe weather event. Here is a list of resources for you to access as you prepare for storm season in Kansas:

- ♦ Weather.gov/top/swaw:
 - Resources include Kansas Weather Spotters Field Guide and the 2025 Kansas Severe Weather Preparedness Packet.
- ♦ Connect with your local County, Township and/or City Emergency Management office. Many will be scheduling Storm Spotter classes in the coming weeks. Most are free to attend and do not require an RSVP.
- ♦ National Emergency Preparedness Month: September 2025.

In the event of a destructive storm or critical event, do you have a list of resources to call to request help? Prioritize your list and be intentional in updating and distributing your list to those responsible for taking the lead on any cleanup or recovery effort.

Be sure to include the District Office (President Panzer) and your DDRC (Donna Williams) on your list.

May is Mental Health Awareness Month

A mental illness is a condition that affects a person's thinking, feeling, behavior or mood. These conditions deeply impact day-to-day living and may also affect the ability to relate to others. Mental health conditions are far more common than you think: 1 in 5 adults experience mental illness each year, and 1 in 6 youth ages 6-17 experience a mental health disorders each year.

A mental health condition is not the result of one event. Research suggests multiple, linking causes including genetics, environment, and lifestyle contribute to someone developing a mental health condition. A stressful job or home life makes some people more susceptible, as do traumatic life events. Biochemical processes, circuits, and basic brain structure may play a role, too.

A treatment team can develop a well-rounded and integrated recovery plan that may include counseling, medications, support groups, education programs and other strategies that work for you. A primary physician can make a referral to an appropriate counselor.

Corporate Transparency Act and Scam Forms

The Corporate Transparency Act (CTA) is a recently enacted federal law effective January 1, 2024, which requires corporate entities to disclose information regarding their beneficial owners and controlling individuals. 501(c)(3) organizations, including church entities, are exempt from filing the CTA report.

With the new act in place, many businesses, organizations, and individuals are receiving "official-looking" forms from entities who are not a federal agency. An example that has come to my attention is a mailing titled "Form 5102 Mandatory Beneficial Ownership Reporting," from either Annual Records Service or Records Management Service with a filing fee of \$119. These forms are a fraudulent attempt to get information and payment; the correspondence is not from a governmental agency. There is also no legitimate fee associated with filing a CTA report.

If your church receives correspondence similar to this, remember that churches are exempt from the CTA and that these forms are a scam. Do <u>not</u> fill out these forms and do <u>not</u> remit payment.

2025 IRS Mileage Rate

Effective January 1, 2025: The IRS new mileage rates are 70¢ per mile for business and 21¢ per mile for medical.

The Kansas District mileage rate, set by the Board of Directors, is 15 cents below the IRS rate, or 55¢ per mile. These new rates apply to mileage reimbursements paid to an employee on or after January 1, 2025, with respect to transportation expenses paid or incurred by the employee on or after January 1, 2025. The rate used for charitable deduction purposes remains at 14¢ per mile.




