15. What should we do when we eat His body and drink His blood, and in this way receive His pledge?

*We should remember and proclaim His death and the shedding of His blood,
 as He taught us: This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.*

16. Why should we remember and proclaim His death?

*First, so we may learn to believe that no creature could make satisfaction for
 our sins. Only Christ, true God and man, could do that. Second, so we may
 learn to be horrified by our sins, and to regard them as very serious. Third,
 so we may find joy and comfort in Christ alone, and through faith in Him be
 saved.*

**20. But what should you do if you are not aware of this need and have
 no hunger and thirst for the Sacrament?**

*To such a person no better advice can be given than this: first, he should
 touch his body to see if he still has flesh and blood. Then he should believe
 what the Scriptures say in Galatians 5 and Romans 7. Second, he should
 look around to see whether he is still in the world, and remember that there
 will be no lack of sin and trouble, as the Scriptures say in John 15-16 and in
 1 John 2 and 5. Third, he will certainly have the devil also around him, who
 with his lying and murdering day and night will let him have no peace
 within or without, as the Scriptures picture him in John 8 and 16; 1 Peter 5;
 Ephesians 6; and 2 Timothy 2.*
