"If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

(John 8:31-32)

(Part 1 of 3)

"Abiding in the Word" (John **8:31-32).** This was the theme for our recently concluded 75th Kansas District Convention.

God's Word is living and active (Heb. 4:12) because it is the Word of the living and life-creating God Himself. The Scriptures teach that all people "are dead in their trespasses and sins" (Eph. 2:1). In Christ, God makes us, who are spiritually dead, alive (Col. 2:13). The apostle Peter writes, "Since you have been born again, not of perishable seed but of imperishable, through the living and abiding Word of God" (1 Pt. 1:23). Yes, God makes us alive through His living Word, and this same living Word continues to work in us and bring blessing to us.

God's living Word is at work within believers (1 Th. 2:13). As you are a believer in Christ, feed on His living, life-giving, life-transforming Word. Peter writes, "....like newborn infants, long for the pure spiritual milk, that by it you may grow up into salvation" (1 Pt. 2:2). Psalm

1:3 says that all who feed on God's Word will be like a tree planted by streams of water.

We must understand that God's living Word contains both the Law and the Gospel. The word of the Law kills, but the word of the Gospel gives life (2 Cor. 3:6). We must not confuse the two. When these two Biblical teachings are mixed, the clear teaching of what God has graciously done for us in Christ then becomes confused. and our hearts are filled with anxiety. Mixing Law and Gospel causes the precious, life-giving medicine of the Gospel to be diluted, losing the power to overcome the sickness of sin. On the other hand, the Law can be diluted to the point where we do not see ourselves as deathly sick, in need of the life-giving Gospel. Confusing or mixing the Law and Gospel robs us of the blessing God promises in Romans 5:1, "Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ."

The greatest blessing of all is that through His Spirit, **God's living Word enables** us to believe and be connected to Jesus, who is the living and incarnate Word of God. Jesus Himself clearly stated in John 5:39 that the Scriptures "bear witness" to Him.

God's Word is inspired (2 Pt. 1:21) and inerrant (2 Tim. 3:16-17). It is entirely reliable and gives us everything we need to know and believe for Christian faith and life.

God's Word accomplishes that which it commands (Isa. 55:11). It creates faith in a person which enables them to repent and to trust in Jesus for salvation (Mark 1:15; Rom. 10:17).

By faith, Christians trust these claims. Jesus stands as the center and object of our faith. In Him, "all the promises of God find their Yes" (2 Cor. 1:20).



Rev. Dr. Geoffrey Robinson organized an **Evangelism Specific Enclave**, which was held July 1-2 on the campus of Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne. Attendees included representatives from the LCMS Office of National Mission, Concordia Seminary-St. Louis, Concordia Theological Seminary-Fort Wayne, and the Indiana, South Wisconsin, Central Illinois, Northern Illinois, and Kansas Districts.

The enclave began by discussing and coming to agreement upon "Seven Theses on Evangelism" as written and presented by Dr. Ken Schurb. This was followed by a discussion of current seminary instruction in the area of evangelism, with the presidents and faculty of both seminaries presenting on their current efforts. During the next portion of the Enclave, Rev. Dan Galchutt and Rev. Dr. Heath Trampe shared the efforts of the Office of National Mission to promote evangelism throughout the Synod. This discussion included ways that Districts can support evangelism efforts. On the second day, discussion turned to teaching evangelism on a congregational level. The Enclave concluded with a discussion of former and potential future partnerships to promote evangelism. These include internships for seminary and CUS students as well as inter-district partnerships. With this in mind, tentative plans have already been made for another Enclave to occur in June of 2026 in Springfield, Illinois.

Lutheran Early Response Team News

On July 17, LERT volunteer Sally Crane, saw a plea for help on social media from an LCMS member in Ottawa. Wind had knocked down a large tree and she needed help to remove it and clean up debris. Sally went by on her way to work and did an assessment, then called her husband, Mike. Mike is an approved LERT chainsaw operator and had the next morning free, so he loaded up his lift and equipment and recruited a friend to help. They were able to get the tree on the ground safely and cut it

up to be stacked. Is it a coincidence that Sally saw the post on social media? No. God put the right people in the right place to lend aid to someone who had a need. That's the way He works: in mysterious ways far beyond our comprehension. 
National Development Grants
