Missions & Stewardship	Resources for missions and stewardship; consulting and coaching for congregations and pastors; support for Kansas church plants and specialized ministries; support for international mission work; scholarships and grants for church workers and students
Education & Youth	Commissioned worker call process, licensure, professional development, and status updates; school accreditation; consulting visits; youth ministry
Caring Ministry	Resources for disaster relief; worker wellness; parish nurse ministry; older adult ministry; <i>Faith at Work</i>
Business Office	Resources and guidance in the areas of church administration, salary and benefits, personnel, and budgeting; Concordia Plans
Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF)	Loans, grants, and ministry support services; investment opportunities
