"If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

(John 8:31-32)

(Part 3 of 3)

What do we now do with this Word of God? He uses us to proclaim His Word, and He Himself gives the promise that it will do exactly what it was sent forth to do. God's Word goes out for the purpose of saving. It condemns the damned sinner and brings to life those who have been crushed in their sins. What joy the forgiveness of sins brings! What peace that surpasses all human understanding. What mercy God gives to us now and forever. What privilege God has given to His baptized people, His royal priests, to proclaim the excellencies of Him who has called us out of darkness into His marvelous light (1 Peter 2:9)! The Gospel goes out to all people, to all nations (Matt. 28:18-20). God wants all to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth (1 Tim. 2:4). He wants us to witness the Gospel to the family member or neighbor, and the Holy Spirit will do the rest. Invite and bring them to the Divine Service, where ears hear the preaching of Christ crucified. The cross shows God's loves for us! Problems, disappointments, struggles and sin continue in this world and in our lives. But there is one truth we and our loved

ones can cling to for absolute assurance — Matt. 24:35: "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away." This same Word became flesh, lived among us, and went to the crucifixion cross to forgive our sins. And this same Word bodily rose from the dead to proclaim victory over sin, death and the devil for us and all people. By faith, Christ and His Word now live in us and we in Him.

Therefore, as we daily feed on the bread and water of life God has given us in His living and active Word, we are enabled by faith to say with Peter: "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." John 6:68.

Dear friends of the LCMS Kansas District, the time of the covid pandemic is over. The time for excuses is over. The time to plan and plant and grow is right now! Let us be those people "abiding in the Word" to now live out and share the living Word.



Jesus Door-2-Door: August & September



On Saturday, August 23, 13 people representing four different LCMS congregations gathered at Zion Lutheran Church (church plant) in Concordia for a Jesus Door-2-Door (JD2D) event.

The large group divided into six canvassing teams and knocked on 160 doors. 55 people answered the door and 42 of them took the survey. Of those who took the survey, exactly 50% of them were confident of their salvation through Jesus Christ alone. 24% of those who took the survey were unchurched. The groups did not find anyone who desired a follow-up visit this time, although three people said they hoped to drop by and visit the Zion congregation soon.

On Saturday, Sept. 13, 13 people gathered at Redeemer Lutheran Church in Lawrence for a **Jesus Door-2-Door (JD2D) event.**

After training in the survey and witnessing methods, the group broke into five teams and went out canvassing the neighborhood near the church. The teams knocked on 148 homes. 45 people answered the door, and 19 of them took the survey.

Of the 19 survey takers, 10 (53%) were unchurched. When asked, "Where do you believe you will go when you die?" five people (26%) said, "I don't know." Five others replied, "To heaven because of Jesus."

Although the teams canvassed within walking distance of the church, 11 out of 19 people (58%) said they were not familiar with Redeemer Lutheran Church. (This highlights how difficult it is for congregations to be 'visible' in the community, especially in population dense areas.)



The next JD2D event (for high schoolers) will be held in St. Louis, Mo., Oct. 10-12. There will also be another JD2D event at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Norton on Saturday, Nov. 15th. Come one, come all!



Members of the Kansas District LERT Leadership Team recently attended the National LCMS Disaster Response Conference in St. Louis, Mo., where we were introduced to the new LCMS LERT Training material due to roll out by the first part of October this year. It has a fresh look, with new elements to address topics most requested by our LERT Training participants.

Also in the planning stage are new additions

that will include online modules for continuing training and education. One of the most frequent concerns has been how to keep teams engaged outside of a disaster, in the everyday life of the church. The Kansas District Training teams will be offering suggestions and encouragement during our training events that will help congregations / teams answer this question as they begin to develop their focus and purpose.

Recognizing the signs—such as sudden changes in behavior, avoiding social situations, or declining performance—is key to early intervention.

Preventing bullying starts with fostering a culture of respect, empathy, and inclusion. Schools, families, and communities should promote open communication, educate about the effects of bullying, and encourage bystanders to speak up. No one should suffer in silence. Together, we can create safe environments where everyone feels valued and protected. If you see something, say something—kindness matters.
