For over a century the Proverbs 31 women of Zion Lutheran Church in rural family to serve in this capacity. Offerle, Kansas, have been utilizing their sewing skills in serving the poor and needy. Monthly, women from Zion and from the Offerle community gather in the fellowship hall of the church to sew and tie quilts for both domestic and foreign missions. On October 19, 1921 the Ladies Aid Society of Zion first began quilting with the intent to serve others. One of the women quilting

today is the third generation in her

Various sizes of quilts are created including baby, youth and full size. They are distributed to Lutheran World Relief, Hospice, Orphan Grain Train, and the Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch. The quilts are sent out with a prayer for Psalm 4:8 to be made manifest in the lives and hearts of the recipients: "In peace I will both lie down and sleep."

"If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

(John 8:31-32)

(Part 2 of 3)

It is through the simple preaching of the crucified and risen Christ that people are converted from unbelief to faith in Christ; from darkness into light; from the world into the church; and from death into life.

Jesus wants pastors to preach the Word of God. Jesus commanded His apostles saying in Luke 24:47 that "repentance and forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all nations." Jesus wants His Word preached because this is how faith is created and nurtured. In his 1879 address, "Duties of an Evangelical Lutheran Synod," C.F.W. Walther writes: "Pastors must direct people to Christ and say, 'You see, we proclaim the pure Word of God, which contains the eternal Gospel. That is why you should cling to us, and that is why we maintain that the moment we no longer do that, you should leave us! For salvation is not in any way dependent on us, nor the Missouri Synod. So, if it does not proclaim the pure Word of God, it is worthless, and you should leave it." Just as the human body cannot long exist without food and water, so also the human spirit needs nourishment

to survive. That food and water for the spirit comes from the Word of God. Spiritual food is so important that the Bible describes God's Word as "bread of life" and "living water" (John 6:35). Jesus explained in Matthew 4:4, "It is written, 'Man shall not live on bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God.""

The baptized "abide in the word" as we are gathered at the pulpit, font, and altar to receive the gifts of Christ in **Word and Sacrament. This** is real, life-sustaining food. Receiving these gifts gives you a good conscience before Christ (Heb. 10:22; 1 Tim. 1:5). With sins forgiven and faith in Christ strengthened, you are set on the path to serve the living God.

Dear friends, abide in God's Word. How? Be regular for every Sunday worship. Commit yourself to giving two-hours at worship—one hour in the Divine Service and one hour in Bible study. Go to Bible study. Continue this pattern of receiving the Word of God at home throughout

the week. Commit yourself to a time of the day when you can do devotions and personal study of God's Word. There are many resources that you can use including the Portals of Prayer. Use it and read the Scriptures that go along with the daily reading. If you would like to pursue something more advanced, I encourage you to purchase the Treasury of Daily Prayer. Commit yourself to a yearly Bible reading plan. There are many to choose from. Fathers, teach your children the Word of God and how to pray in the home. Have that weekly faith then further nurtured on Sunday morning.

If we are a church body that prides itself in having the true Word of God, then we must be in and abide in the Word of God. 1 Peter 5:8. "Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour." 2 Peter 3:18, "But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ." 1 Peter 3:15, "Always be prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect."



In the early morning hours of June 22^r a powerful windstorm powered through Wichita with

Lutheran Early Response Team

winds clocked at 101mph at Dwight D. Eisenhower National Airport. Kenneth and Vickie Lessman, members at Trinity Lutheran Church, suffered significant damage to a 100-year-old Hackberry tree that fell across their backyard over two buildings. The estimate to remove the tree from the buildings was cost prohibitive, so they contacted me. I assessed the work and made some calls. Thanks to the generosity of LCMS Disas-

ter Response, Orphan Grain Train, LCMS Kansas District and **Trinity Lutheran** Church, grants were issued to cover the removal of the tree and restoration of the property. Hosted by Trinity, Wichita, a LERT Approved Chainsaw team worked Aug. 22-23 to remove the tree from the buildings, cut it up and move it into position to be removed by a private individual. With Phase 1 completed, we can now focus on Phase 2 – restoration. We owe a huge debt of gratitude to our LERT partners in Tulsa, Okla., St. Peters, Mo., King of Kings, Gardner, Kan., and Zion, Newton, Kan. The lending of your skills and equipment has made all the difference in the success of this project.

There will be District workshops offered that provide simple, straightforward help relating to clergy tax and church treasurer issues. The presenters will be Kansas District Business Manager Heather Williams and Nebraska District Business Manager Elijah Luebbe. Participants will also hear from Concordia Plan Services and meet fellow servants from their specific church region. A free lunch will be provided, sponsored by the Lutheran Church Extension Fund. Some of the topics that will be covered at the workshops include a review of the Congregational Treasurers Manual, borrowing and investment options through LCEF, narrative budgets, salary guidelines, board governance, internal control, planned giving, clergy taxes, document retention, employer resources, and employees vs. contractors.

These workshops are geared towards new and returning congregational treasurers, bookkeepers, financial secretaries, office managers, stewardship leaders, pastors, church members and/or staff who have financial or administrative responsibilities.






