What do we now do with this Word of God? He uses us to proclaim His Word, and He Himself gives the promise that it will do exactly what it was sent forth to do. What peace that surpasses all human understanding. What mercy God gives to us now and forever. ones can cling to for absolute assurance — Matt. 24:35: "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away." This same Word became flesh, lived among us, and went to the crucifixion cross to forgive our sins. And this same Word bodily rose from the dead to proclaim victory over sin, death and the devil for us and all people. By faith, Christ and His Word now live in us and we in Him.

Therefore, as we daily feed on the bread and water of life God has given us in His living and active Word, we are enabled by faith to say with Peter: "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." John 6:68.
